On Monday afternoon, when the enormous sale of seats became manifest, 250 extra chairs were ordered and distributed through the hall. Yoeman work was performed by the secretaries of the Y. M. C. A. and their lieutenants, and it is due to their efforts that the terrific strain upon the capacity of the hall was scarcely noticeable, beyond the fact that the audience was a very big one and eager to see and hear.

With a view to affording Mr. Bryan an opportunity of studying the country, between Buenos Aires and Campana, and to visit the Frigorificos at the latter place, the Central Argentine railway placed a special coach to the train leaving Retiro at 8 a. m. yesterday. Mr. Bryan, who was accompanied by Mr. Ernest Nelson, had a most pleasant journey and on returning to the city at 4 p. m. expressed his great admiration for the up-to-date methods employed at the meat works, and fine appearance of the country en route.

This morning Dr. Victorino de la will give a breakfast at the Jockey club in honor of Mr. Bryan.

The Hon. Charles Sherrill, the American minister, will hold a reception this afternoon from 5 to 7 o'clock at the legation, 636 Calle Charcas in honor of Mr. Bryan.

Tomorrow, introduced by Mr. Sherrill, Mr. Bryan will be presented to the president of the republic, Dr. Figueroa Alcorta.
