Cardinal Gibbons was appointed by President Taft to be a member of the board of Indian commissioners, to take the place of the late Archbishop Ryan.

Senator Brown, of Nebraska, advocated popular election of senators in a speech in the senate.

Senator Bourne delivered a speech in the senate in support of the Oregon plan. Referring to this speech, the Associated Press says: "Taking advantage of the pendency of the resolution providing for the direct vote of the people in the election of United States senators, Mr. Bourne expiated upon the advantages of the Oregon system. Mr. Bourne said that with its registration plan, Australian ballot, direct primaries and initiative and referendum, Oregon had evolved the best system yet formed for the control of elections. He spoke of the initiative and referendum as the arch of popular government and contended for the right to recall an official once chosen as a proper corollary of this system. If capable of electing he was sure that the people could be depended on not to exercise the right to recall a competent official."

President Taft has issued the following proclamation, calling for funds for the plague sufferers in China: "As president of the American Red Cross I appeal to the people of this country to aid the unfortunate multitudes who are dying of starvation because of famine in China, either by money contributions, which should be sent to the local Red Cross, Washington, D. C.,

or by assisting in raising a cargo of flour and other suitable supplies to be sent to these people. Congress has granted the use of an army transport to the Red Cross for this purpose. The Seattle Commercial Club, of Seattle, Wash., is co-operating with the Red Cross, and will act as receiving and forwarding agent for all supplies. I trust that our people will respond generously and that the transportation lines will aid in the delivery at Seattle."

The house has adopted an amendment to the Moon bill for the codification of laws relating to the judiciary, increasing the salary of the chief justice of the United States from \$13,000 to \$15,000 and the salaries of the associate justices from \$12,500 to \$14,500 a year.

Representative Harrison, of New York, introduced a resolution requesting the president to reconvene congress March 4, for the purpose of revising, downward, the schedules of the Payne-Aldrich tariff law.
