The Washington correspondent for the Associated Press says: "Encouraged by the smooth working of their new legislative machine, which recently began to grind, democratic leaders of the house planned to extend their tariff revision program. Representative Raney, Illinois, has introduced in the house a resolution designed to open the way for a thorough investigation of the department of justice. mittee of nine, six democrats and three republicans—conduct the investigation, and asks an appropriation of \$150,000 to cover the expense. An Associated Press correspondent, under date of April 11, says: "Reciprocity with Canada and a farmer's free list, it was decided at the democratic caucus held here recently, will be the legislation taken up in the order named by the present house of representatives. The woolen and cotton schedules, according to present indications, will follow.

"In the caucus there was no opposition to Canadian reciprocity, and no changes or additions to the bill as presented by Chairman Underwood of the house ways and means committee were offered by those present.

"On the free list will be included those things which the farmer needs most, namely, agricultural implements, dressed meat and meat products, flour, rough lumber, boots, shoes and saddles; wire fencing, bailing wire, cotton bagging, cotton ties, bagging ties, burlap and salt.

"On many of these products the present tariff is practically prohibitive and there are few importations of them on that account. It is impossible for this reason to estimate what the difference will amount to by putting them on the free list.

> "It is probable the Canadian reciprocity bill will be introduced Thursday. Its introduction and the farmer's free list bill as caucus measures will not stand in the way of immediate introduction of the three important measures-popular election of senators, publicity before election of campaign contributions and statehood for Arizona and New Mexico. These are not to be treated as caucus measures, but will come in as party bills and will be taken up for action as soon as they can be reported from their committees. Another caucus is to be held to debate the revision of the wool and cotton schedules, to be taken up in the house following the passage of the reciprocity and the free list bills.


"The caucus voted a straight indorsement of the Underwood reciprocity bill, 128 ayes, 29 nays and 6 voting present.
