over peoples whom they feared we might exploit, not serve and assist. But we have not exploited them.

We have been their friends and have sought to serve them. And our dominion has been a menace to no other nation. We redeemed our honor to the utmost in our dealings with Cuba. She is weak but absolutely free; and it is her trust in us that makes her free. Weak people ever stand ready to give us any authority among them that will assure them a like friendly oversight and direction. They know that there is no ground for fear in receiving us as their mentors and guides. Our isolation was ended twenty years ago; and now fear of us is ended also, our counsel and association sought after and desired. There can be no question of our ceasing to be a world power. The only question is whether we can refuse the moral leadership that is offered us, whether we shall accept or reject the confidence of the world.

HAND OF GOD DID IT

The war and the conference of peace now sitting in Paris seem to me to have answered that question. Our participation in the war established our position among the nations and nothing but our own mistaken action can alter it. It was not an accident or a matter of sudden choice that we are no longer isolated and devoted to a policy which has only our own interest and advantage for its object. It was our duty to go in, if we were indeed the champions of liberty and right. We answered to the call of duty in a way so spirited, so utterly without thought of what we spent of blood or treasure, so effective, so worthy of the admiration of true men everywhere, so wrought out of the stuff of all that was heroic, that the whole world saw at last, in the flesh, in noble action, a great ideal asserted and vindicated, by a nation they had deemed material and now found to be compact of the spiritual forces that must free men of every nation from every unworthy bondage. It is thus that a new role and a new responsibility have come to this great nation that we honor and which we would all wish to lift to yet higher levels of service and achievement.

The stage is set, the destiny disclosed. It has come about by no plan of our conceiving but by the hand of God who led us into this way. We cannot turn back. We can only go forward, with lifted eyes and freshened spirit, to follow the vision. It was of this that we dreamed at our birth. America shall in truth show the way. The light streams upon the path ahead, and nowhere else.

ITALY POUTING

The criticism of that Italian newspaper of President Wilson, written and published after his departure and printed in these columns Wednesday, would seem to indicate that Italy did not get in the treaty all that she was hoping to get when she went to war. Italy is not alone, either. Most of the European countries are feeling the same way about it, which would seem to indicate that justice had been done and that selfishness had been exiled from the peace table. Meantime it would be well for Italy and the others to be reminded that if it hadn't been for President Wilson and the people he represents, each of them, instead of getting a fair deal and a just proportion of the fruits of victory, would be getting precisely what a victorious Germany might be pleased to give them—and it doesn't take a very vivid imagination to indicate what that portion would have been.
