were paid for; now they are merely robbed on the high seas. The United States government has delayed making an effectual protest to Great Britain against this high-sea piracy because of the complications arising from the Lusitania, Arabic and similar horrors which fixed public attention upon the questions affecting life rather

In the meantime, the British policy of destroying the British policy of destroying American trade relations with Holland, Denmark, Norway and Sweden has been pursued with the utmost diligence.
