LATER FROM CALIFORNIA.

Highly Important from Nicaragua. NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 10. The steamer Texas, with dates from San Juan to December 5th, and from California to the 20th ult., reached here to-day.

The steamer Tennessee takes forward \$270,000 in treasure.

The following is the vote of California at the Presidential election: Buchanan, 60,000; Fillmore, 85,000; Fremont, 19,000. The Democrats also have a majority in both Houses.

The markets at San Francisco were dull. No other news of interest.

Advices from Nicaragua are important, and indicate Walker's success in a series of battles with the combined forces of Central Americans.

On the 10th of November Gen. Hornsby, with two hundred men, defeated eleven hundred of the enemy under the Costa Rican General, Canas. The enemy lost two hundred. Hornsby's loss was two killed and eleven wounded.

Four days fighting at Wassaga ended in the entire defeat of the enemy. Walker then returned to Granada, giving three days' notice of his intention to destroy that city in order to give the inhabitants time to remove their valuables. He then fired the place, and not a vestige is said to remain. Walker then removed all his effects, men and the inhabitants of Granada to Rivas, which city is henceforth to be the Capital of Nicaragua.

A naval battle took place between the Nicaraguan war schooner Granada, Capt. Fayox, and a Costa Rican brig of war three times its size. The Costa Rican vessel was blown up, and all lives lost.

It is supposed that the Costa Ricans have lost 3,000 men in various battles since October.

SENR. CHARLES HOWARD WRECKED.

While the gale was at its wild fury Tuesday evening about 9 o'clock, a messenger came to the city from the Lake View House, five miles North of the piers, and reported a vessel coming ashore at that point, and that those on board must inevitably be lost unless aided from the shore. As soon as they could prepare for the attempt, a company of the following persons procured a life boat and started for the rescue.

Capt. Gray, C. L. Bissell, N. K. Fairbank, Isaac Walker, Agent of the Lake Navigation Company, Captain Moore of the Brig Fontanelle, and Capt. of the schooner Kate Richmond.

Mr. Bissell taking a horse preceded the party following with the life boat on a wagon, and reached the wreck in time to spring into the water and drag out a half-drowned sailor who had attempted to reach the shore on the same lumber. The party with the life boat went to the wreck and took Capt. Mahony and four sailors who were still clinging to it. They reached the shore about midnight. The Captain and crew were nearly dead from cold and exposure. Such gallant and noble conduct on the part of those who manned the boat stamps them as men worthy of the highest praise.

Returns of the surveys of public lands in Utah Territory have been received by the Commissioner of the General Land Office from the Surveyor General of the Territory. These returns embrace the valleys of Salt Lake, Cache, Malad, Blue Spring, and Hansel, North of the base line; the valleys of Tullis and Bush, West of the Meridian; and the valleys of Jordan, Utah, Cedar, Tinetti, and Yohab, to the South, exhibiting surveys of our hundred and thirty sectional townships.—Union.

THE GADSDEN PURCHASE.—A NEW TERRITORY.—California papers state that on the 29th of August, a large number of persons, from different parts of the Gadsden purchase, assembled at Tucson, to take the necessary steps to form a Territorial government. It is proposed to call the new Territory Arizona. The estimated population is ten thousand.

HEALTH OF DR. KANE.—We regret to learn from our New York exchanges that letters from London by the last steamer bring the most discouraging accounts of the health of the brave Arctic navigator. He was very pale and much reduced in flesh, and his night sweats were terrible. His cough also was alarming. His physicians had enjoined him to leave for a warmer climate as soon as possible, and he was accordingly to sail on Monday, the 17th of November, for St. Thomas and Havana.

OSWEGO, December 6. The recent sale on Lake Ontario has proved very disastrous to the shipping. The schooner Niagara, coal loading, from Oswego to Bond Head, went ashore at Port Hope. The crew were in great peril, when Capt. Wild of the schooner Anna, and Robert Campbell, mate of another schooner, made an attempt to rescue them, and were both drowned.

The schooner Caledonia is ashore near Toronto, and the brig Beayer at Braddock Point.

The steamer Lady Elgin went ashore near Presqu'isle, and is a total wreck.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6. The President has removed G. W. Clark, the alleged murderer of Barbour, in Kansas, from the office of Indian Agent in that Territory, and appointed Isaac Winston, (Whig) of Calpepper county, Va., in his place.

December 5. Wheeler, the Minister at Central America, has been peremptorily recalled by the President, reason—his recognition of the existing Nicaraguan Government, which the Administration have deliberately resolved not to recognize.

BOSTON, Dec. 5. The failure of Henshaw & Son, the well known bankers of this city, was announced this morning. The liabilities are large.

Mr. Henshaw, Sr., was a trustee of the Rutland Railroad, and was connected with other roads.

NEW YORK, Dec. 5. Jacob Little, the extensive financier, failed to meet his payment at the Board of Brokers this morning. His liabilities are to an immense amount, and the affair has created considerable excitement in money circles.

A great breeze has been raised in Detroit in consequence of the discovery of horse beef in sausages, made by a German in that city. According to the French authority, horse beef is as good as any; and in Paris at the present time, sorrel steaks, iron grey chops and roan sausages are eaten with great relish.

THE WESTERN TERRITORIES.—These are now open for settlement the Territories, of Minnesota, Oregon, Nebraska, Washington, New Mexico, Utah and Kansas. The Territories contain, according to a compendium of the census of 1850, an area of 1,400,934 square miles. The whole area of the States and Territories belonging to the Union being 2,980,166 square miles, the Territories, it will be seen, comprise nearly one-half of the whole.

REMOVAL OF THE FLORIDA INDIANS.—It is stated that the Secretaries of War and the Interior have concluded an important arrangement for the peaceful removal of the Seminole Indians from Florida. A delegation of Seminole Chiefs from the West of the Mississippi will be sent to Florida with presents and promises of liberal grants of land.

Senator Fugh submitted to the Senate on the 11th ult., a proposition, described by the telegraphic reporter as "for the survey of the Ohio river, and its tributaries, as a continuation of the grand system of the River and Harbor Improvements, inaugurated at the last Session of Congress."

DIFFICULTY BETWEEN SWITZERLAND AND PRUSSIA.—The principal feature of the political news by the latest European arrival is the firm attitude assumed by Switzerland against the demands of Prussia in the affair of Neuchatel. Switzerland has given a direct and unconditional refusal to the Prussian Minister's direct demands.

It is stated that Mr. Buchanan will be in Washington about the first of February, and that the composition of the cabinet will not be fully determined until previous to his arrival at the federal capital.
