Both these powers support the action of the United States Government in its endeavors to obtain reparation for past outrages, and security for future travel across the Isthmus. The fact that England and France entertain these views is well known to our Government.

Nevertheless, in consideration of the fact that our opponent in this quarrel is a feeble State, and one that has always been friendly, our Government is disposed to be magnanimous. Whatever appearances may be, it is not believed that the question will have other than a pacific solution. X. Y. Z.
