## Governor—Public Meeting.

At a meeting of citizens of this county, held pursuant to call in reference to the resignation of Gov. Richardson, R. W. Farnas was called to the chair and E. D. Allen chosen Secy.

On motion, a committee of three, was appointed to report resolutions expressive of the sense of the meeting.

U. C. Johnson, D. Seigel and H. S. Thorpe were appointed such committee who after a short absence, reported the following:

Whereas, we have learned that our present worthy Executive, Governor Wm. A. Richardson, has determined upon vacating the Executive chair of this Territory, a position which he has since his appointment, filled with much credit to himself, and satisfaction to the people of Nebraska. And whereas, it best accords with the institutions of our Democratic system of Government, that the people among whom the duties of such an office, are to be exercised, and whose interests are to be immediately affected by the discharge of those duties, should be allowed to designate the office. And whereas, it is earnestly desired by the people of Nebraska, that their Chief Executive should be chosen from among our citizens.—Therefore be it

Resolved.—That R. W. Farnas, Geo. H. Nixon, M. F. Clark and Jesse Noel be, and are hereby, appointed Delegates from Nemaha County to a Convention to be convened at Omaha City on Saturday, the 19th day of Sept., A. D. 1858.

Resolved.—That it shall be the duty of said Delegates to join with such Delegates, as may be appointed from other Counties of the Territory, in recommending some good and efficient citizen of the Territory of Nebraska as successor to Gov. Richardson as Governor of this Territory.

Resolved.—That we hereby, instruct the said Delegates to vote in the said convention for the Hon. S. W. Black of Nebraska City, to fill the office of the Chief Executive of this Territory.
