

OFFICIAL LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES

Session of the Thirty-second Congress. A. LIX.—An Act making Appropriations for the Legislative, Executive, and Judicial Expenses of the Government for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December, and sixty four, and for the year eighteen hundred and sixty three, and for other purposes.

Secretary of State and Assistant Secretary of State, messenger, assistant messenger, and laborer in his office, five hundred dollars. For the incidental and contingent expenses of said Department.—For publishing the laws in pamphlet form, and for the printing of the Statutes at Large, and in the city of Washington seven thousand one hundred and twenty five dollars.

For stationary blank books, plans, drawings, and other contingent expenses of the office of the Commissioner of Public Affairs, five hundred dollars. For the salary of the auditor of the Office of Public Affairs, five hundred dollars.

Contingent Expenses of Post Office Department. For blank books, binding and stationery for the post office, five hundred dollars. For the salary of the auditor of the Office of Public Affairs, five hundred dollars.

For the salary of the chief clerk in the Department of Agriculture, two thousand dollars. For the collection and compiling of agricultural statistics, for promoting agricultural and rural economy, and for procuring, propagation, and distribution of the cuttings and seeds of new and useful varieties, and for the introduction and protection of insectivorous birds, and for the purpose of establishing a laboratory with the necessary apparatus for practical and scientific experiments in agricultural chemistry, and for paying the clerks and employees and contingent expenses necessary in the conduct of the said office, five hundred dollars.

For the salary of the chief clerk in the Department of Agriculture, two thousand dollars. For the collection and compiling of agricultural statistics, for promoting agricultural and rural economy, and for procuring, propagation, and distribution of the cuttings and seeds of new and useful varieties, and for the introduction and protection of insectivorous birds, and for the purpose of establishing a laboratory with the necessary apparatus for practical and scientific experiments in agricultural chemistry, and for paying the clerks and employees and contingent expenses necessary in the conduct of the said office, five hundred dollars.
