THE NEWS. A caucus of the Republican members of Congress have agreed to adjourn Congress on the 23d.

Post Master General Dennison and Attorney General Speed have resigned their positions in the Cabinet, because they are Union men and will not by their positions countenance Pres. Johnson's attempt to destroy the Union party.

The latest news speaks of several battles between the Austrians and Prussians, in most of which both claim the advantage. Prussia has succeeded in affecting an important treaty with the lesser German States, which will give her a great advantage in the present struggle.

The Tennessee Legislature is now in session. The Upper House has ratified the Constitutional Amendment, and the Lower House will do so as soon as enough of the rebel members, who have deserted, can be brought in to form a quorum. It is said President Johnson is using his influence to prevent its ratification.

The President, on the 10th, sent in his veto of the New Freedmen's Bureau Bill. The opposition candidate to General Worth for Governor of North Carolina will be General W. W. Ransom, formerly of the rebel army.
