The first reason that suggests to us the impropriety of this step is the fact that none of the State lands have yet been selected, and yet the present scheme is to locate all of the public buildings upon State lands. The propositions may be consistent, yet at this distance it appears that a definite location and possession of these lands should naturally precede the location of any of the public buildings to make such location profitable to the State or permanent.

This seems to have been the intention at one time, to locate our lands first, asindicated by the passage of a Joint Resolution requesting the Secretary of the Interior to withdraw from Scrip or Warrant entry the public lands of Nebraska until the State lands could be selected.
