Legislative Legends main.

The tact and the ingenuity of the

American people are proverbial. And

not only has this peculiar faculty been

developed in all the various branches and

pursuits of usual life, but to a remarka-

bly extent has it prevailed in the diplo-

macy and legislation of government.

A prominent illustration of the power

and efficiency of these wonderful gifts

has been recently furnished us by our

legislative solemn. So generally has be-

come the hostility of the people to all

special grants and franchises, and the

creation of monopolies, which have natu-

ally been kicked or souled in the game,

that they have in many instances incor-

porated in their Organic Act, a positive

and unqualified prohibition against the

exercise of this power. The Constitu-

tion of Nebraska under the influence of

example of other States, in terms requires

all corporations to be formed under a

general law.

This was a wise provision, intended to

protect the people from the exacting

demands of remote bodies, and pre-

venting up to fair competition, every thing

that required "corporate bodies" to ex-

ecute. No one class so much secured

the commendation of our citizens, and

but for the cupid and cunning of some,

would have vouchsafed to the people the

adequate protection. But there were

others, whom these guarantees did not

suit. The land grabber, the speculator, the

monopolist, were on the alert, and as

sooner schemes seemed destined to de-

feat, unless this constitutional barrier was

overcome, set right diligently to work,

and under their magic influence beheld

how constitutional prohibitions can be

surmounted. Section 75 of the general

law of incorporation reads as follows:

Such incorporation shall be authorized

and empowered to locate, construct, fur-

nish, maintain, operate and enjoy a Rail-

road with single or double track, with

such side tracks, turn-outs, offices and
