CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

Official. Mayor Office, Brownville, April 28, 1886.

Present: Geo. W. Fairbourn, Mayor. Jas. L. Carson, R. W. Furnas, Jas. L. McGee, Aldermen.

Resolved, that the Mayor appoint three standing committees—one on Finance, one on Streets and Alley, and one on Ways and Means. Adopted.

Resolved, that the Mayor be instructed to procure a desk for the use of the city, at a cost not exceeding four dollars. Yes—Carson; Nays—Furnas and McGee. Motion lost.

Moved, that a special committee be appointed on Unfinished Business. Carried.

The Mayor appointed Messrs. McGee, Carson and Furnas as the committee.

The report of William H. Hoover, Treasurer, was taken up and on motion referred to committee on Unfinished Business.

William H. Hoover presented his account for services as City Treasurer, \$150. Referred to committee on Unfinished Business.

Thomas R. Fisher presented his account for services as Engineer, amounting to \$11.60. Referred to committee on Unfinished Business.

On motion, the Street Commissioner was instructed to proceed without delay to repair the damage done to the streets by the late rains.

On motion the City Clerk was directed to give written notice to the late Street Commissioner, to turn over all implements and tools belonging to the city, into his possession, at the present office.
