Nebraska Trunk Railroad. ATCHISON, Aug. 26.—The contract for building the Nebraska Trunk Railroad, from the State line to Nebraska City, has been let to Eastern parties.

The Hon. Geo. Crow, a member of the Legislature from Nemaha county, learning that the Governor was about calling an extra session of the Legislature sometime this fall, sent in to the Governor his resignation, which will be accepted if not withdrawn before the tenth of September.

THE ONE UNIVERSITY, located at Nebraska City, and under the auspices of the Presbyterian Church, has been in successful operation for a year past, and is now entering upon its second year. The buildings have been thoroughly renovated and repaired, and a corps of able teachers secured.

Col. R. W. Furnas informs us that work on the Trunk Railroad will commence this week. It presents no very heavy grading, and we are assured that ten miles will be completed before February 15th, and perhaps more. The contract is let to the town of Peru.
