The Convocation of the Episcopal clergy, last in Omaha (Nebraska), in this city, on Sunday last, consisted of a series of very solemn and impressive services, beginning on Saturday evening and closing on Monday. The clergy present were the Bishop of the Diocese, Dr. Clarkson, the Rev. Dr. McNamara, President of Nebraska College, the Rev. Prof. Rixon, of Nebraska College, the Rev. Wm. Talbot of Peru, the Rev. Mr. Chamberlain, of Council Bluffs, and the Rector of Christ's Church, Brownville. The first service was held on Saturday evening at 7 1/2 o'clock, the Rev. Dr. McNamara preaching a very able and eloquent convocation sermon, on the power of truth as found in the truth inculcated by his doctrine, in contradistinction to infidelity.

On Sunday morning the principal feature of the service was the ordination of Prof. John Lyon, of Falls City, and W. H. Wilson, a colored man, to the "holy order of Deacons." Morning prayer was read by Rev. Mr. Chamberlain and Prof. Rixon. The ordination was presided over by the Rev. Dr. McNamara, assisted by the Rev. Dr. Rixon, and the Rev. Mr. Talbot. The service was held at 7 1/2 o'clock, and was in his usual style, full of earnest words and outpourings of the Holy Spirit. The candidates for the Holy Communion, assisted by the Rev. Dr. McNamara, a large number receiving the sacrament. In the afternoon the Rev. Prof. Rixon and the Rev. Mr. Wilson, addressed the Sunday School of the Parish. Evening service was held at 7 1/2 o'clock, and conducted by the Rev. Mr. Lyon and the Rev. Mr. Wilson, the newly ordained deacons. The Bishop presided from the front, "and he went away sorrowing." The sermon was full of glowing thought and loving words, to impel men, and full of comfort to the timid Christians. At the close of the service, the Bishop administered what he called the "apostolic rite of confirmation" to five candidates, addressing them with fatherly words and bidding them God speed in their Christian course, and closing the service with the blessing of peace. At these services, which were crowded to its utmost capacity, many going away under a gain admission. The music was of a high order, purely churchly in its character, and directed by Mrs. Davis, with her usual ability. The offerings of the people were appropriated to the missions of the Diocese, amounting to nearly \$200.

On Monday morning the convocation held a business meeting, and adjourned to meet in St. Mary's Church, Nebraska City, at the call of the Bishop. The Rev. Mr. Lyon was formerly a Methodist Minister of considerable standing, in the State of Michigan. The Rev. Mr. Wilson has charge of St. Augustine's Mission at Nebraska City, and we understand, impressed on all classes of citizens, with his zeal in laboring among his own people.

We may well congratulate the Rev. Mr. Davis on the growth and prosperity of his Parish, and the beauty and order of the Convocation services.

The Bishop and Clergy return their sincere thanks to the parishioners of Christ's Church and the citizens of Brownville, for their kind attentions during their stay among them.
