with an instrument called a "rake," and should be finished in thirty days, or roots grow on the wet willows; and the sooner they dry after being peeled, the whiter they will be. The cost of cutting and stripping is from one hundred to one hundred and fifty dollars per acre.

A SCIENTIFIC BEE MAN.

A correspondent writes to the Cotman's Rural World as follows: Be-Hil, Mo., July 1, 1871.

Mr. Ell Sea Wright—I have got a nest of bees; I cross a box of the honey order, and had great success in hatching the eggs, which I put under a gobbler; the young bees are now out, and I am waiting for the queen to hatch. I have introduced them in to my hives so as to make no stock for me; I will give you two of the queens for your use, if you wish to try them next spring. My queens are pure to look at; their gold and red, a black mix with the bands on a queen, and a green head; (I think the queen has got some paras queen); that has no sting that I see, and no ar workers; that is not in market now. All old bees are quite well and lively; that is good news for you. Some more in sense that went of in hopes to gather stores, which I think is a sign of a long and hard winter. I will write to you as I can keep my bees on a safe winter—drive a little honey now. Now come, you need not bring your queen now, as I think I can take her. A SON FLOUR.

THINKING OUT FRUIT.

It is difficult to give a specific rule applicable to all cases for thinning out fruit. Every tree, however, knows its own mind; if trees are allowed to overbear, the fruit will be proportionately small and far more likely to be deformed and of inferior quality. It is far better to have a less number of specimens and all large and fine, than many small ones, as the former will usually measure as much as the latter and bring more in market. Nearly all of the large fruits, like apples and pears, should be thinned when not more than half grown, and where they are produced in clusters it is better to remove but one, leaving the largest and most prominent specimen. It is also well to notice the difference in quantity upon the different branches, and so thin that no more fruit will remain on one side of the tree than the other. This of course cannot always be done, because cold winds or late frosts may have blighted the blossoms on one side and not on the other; but by using a little forethought and making observations before commencing the operation, an equal distribution of the fruit over the whole tree can be established. It is also a good plan to go about the orchard once or twice a week and remove any specimens of fruit that have been stung by insects; such fruit, however, should not be thrown upon the ground, where the larva within can come to maturity, but should be either given to hogs or otherwise effectually destroyed.

WHEAT.—The committee on wheat inspection in St. Louis has established the following rules for grading the new crop:

- No. 1 White—To be bright, sound, dry, plump, and well cleaned pure. No. 2 White—To be sound, dry, well cleaned pure. No. 3 White—To be sound, dry, well cleaned pure. No. 4 White—To be sound, dry, and reasonably cleaned. No. 1 Red—To be bright, sound, plump, dry and well cleaned red, or red and white mixed. No. 2 Red—To be sound, well cleaned, dry, red, and white mixed, free from rye. No. 3 Red—To include all sound, dry, reasonably cleaned, red, or red and white mixed, below No. 2 red. No. 4 Red—To include dry red, white, mixed thin or bleached, free from rye. Rejected—All damp, tough, musty, very smutty, trashy, dirty, damaged, thin, falling below No. 4.
