

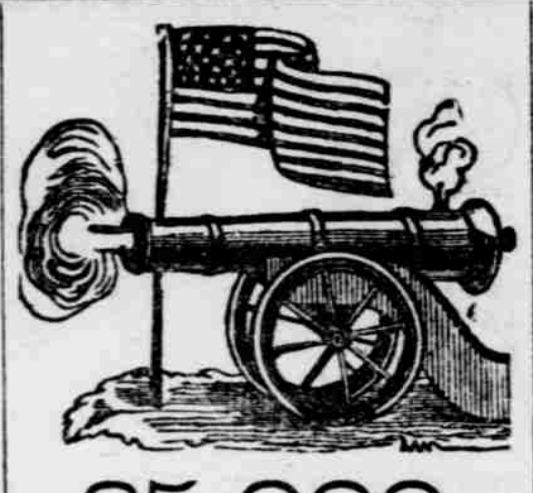

There is war with the Indians again. This time it is the Utes, in the northwest, whose agency is about 200 miles from Ft. Rawlins, the nearest post by rail, on the U. P. On the 29th, Major Thornburg in attempting to reach the agency with three companies of cavalry, had a fight in a canyon on Milk River.

It is the same old story—surprise, ambush, ten Indians for every soldier, messengers, etc. The little command of heroes were surrounded, but cut their way out, losing their brave commander and twelve men, and having 40 wounded. The remnant of the army after the fall of Thornburg, entrenched themselves in rifle pits where they remained for several days with Indians swarming around ready with their excellent long range rifles to shoot at any head that might be exposed.

Two days after the fight, Lieut. Dodge with a detachment of 30 brave colored troops went to the rescue of the beleaguered Payne, performing a deed of daring not often equaled. In running the gauntlet of the savages he had peculiar luck, having nearly every horse in his little command shot down, but succeeded in reaching Payne without the loss of a man; and never before did a lot of colored men receive a more sincere and cordial welcome.
