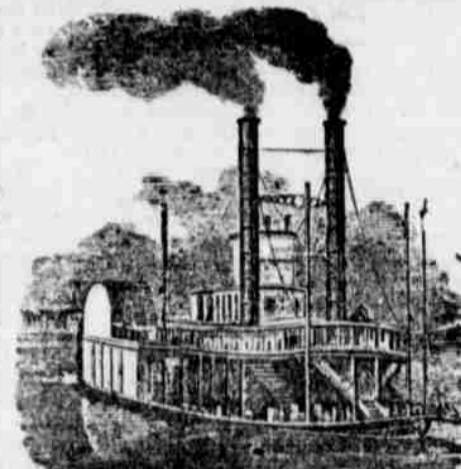

**Proposals for Military Supplies.**

Headquarters Department of the Platte, Chief Quartermaster's office, Omaha, Neb., March 7 1882.

SEALED PROPOSALS in triplicate, subject to the usual conditions, will be received at this office until 12 o'clock, M., on Tuesday, April 18th, 1882, or at the same hour, (allowing for the difference in time) at the offices of the Quartermasters at the following named stations, at which places and time they will be opened in the presence of the bidders, for the furnishing and delivery of Military Supplies during the year commencing July 1st, 1882, and ending June 30th, 1883, as follows: Wood, hay and charcoal, or such of said supplies as may be required at Omaha Depot, Fort Omaha, Fort Niobrara, Fort Sidney, Cheyenne depot, Fort Russell, Fort Sanborn, Fort Steele, Fort Hall, Fort Douglas, Fort Cameron, Fort Robinson, Fort Bridger, Fort Laramie, Fort Fetterman, Fort McKinney, Fort Washburn and Fort Thornburgh.

Proposals will also be received at this office up to the day and hour above named, for the delivery on the cars at the point nearest to the mines on the line of the Union Pacific Railway, of 8,000 tons of coal, of 2,240 pounds to the ton. Allow for the delivery at the Omaha depot, or at stations on the main line of the Union Pacific Railway east from Kearney Junction, of two million pounds corn and one million pounds oats. Bids for grain should state the rate per 100 pounds—not per bushel.

Proposals for either class of the stores mentioned, or for quantities less than the whole required, will be received. Each proposal should be in triplicate, separate for each article at each station, and must be accompanied by a bond in the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) executed strictly in accordance with the printed instructions and upon the blank form furnished under this advertisement guaranteeing that the party making the proposal shall not withdraw the same within sixty days from the date announced for opening them; and that if said proposal is accepted and a contract for the supplies bid for, awarded thereunder, he will within ten days after being notified of the award (provided such notification be made within the sixty days above mentioned,) accept the same and furnish good and sufficient sureties, at once, for the faithful performance of the contract.

The Government reserves the right to reject any or all proposals.

A preference will be given to articles of domestic production. Blank proposals and printed circulars, stating the kind and estimated quantities of Wood, Hay and Charcoal required at each station, and giving full instructions as to the manner of bidding, conditions to be observed by bidders and terms of contracts, &c., will be furnished on application to this Office or to the Quartermasters at the various stations named.
