At a meeting of the republican national committee in Washington Saturday, the sentiment of those present unanimously favored the republicans in the south uniting with the liberal democrats and working for a free ballot and fair count.

Mrs. Scoville's petition for the appointment of a conservator of the es tate of Guiteau came up Saturday before Judge Loomis in Chicago. The court refused to hear the petition, and Mrs. Scoville's attorney will appeal the matter to the supreme court.

The remainder were ticketed to Dakota and Minnesota, 80 per cent. to the latter.
