The affairs from the Zurich Conference are to the last when at a meeting of the plenipotentiaries the limits of the Lombardian frontiers are under consideration. A meeting of the Deputy Plenipotentiaries of the three Powers was also held on the 1st.

It is reported that Austria intends to disannex the portion of the Austrian dominions which will be transferred to Lombardy, and to sell the public domains.

The Emperor of France has indicated to the Pope that he will support the project of the Suez Canal for commercial purposes.

Italy.—The First National Assembly at Bologna was opened on the 1st of September by the Governor-General, who in his speech congratulated the people on the alacritv with which they had hastened to the electoral districts to record their votes.

A letter from Bologna states that at the popular elections the priests denigrated their votes as freely as the citizens, and that the result was that an immense majority had gone in favor of the liberal ticket, which goes against the re-establishment on any condition of the temporal power of the Pope.

The finances of Romagna were in excellent condition and there was no doubt the new government would be able to go on without a loan, since the overthrow of the temporal power of the Pope.
