CIRCULAR

To Land Officers in the Territories of Minnesota, Kansas and Nebraska.

BY joint resolution of Congress, approved

March 31, 1857, valid pre-emption claims

on the 16th and 36th sections, heretofore re-

served for schools in the Territories of Min-

nesota, Kansas and Nebraska, will be recog-

nized, where the settlement has been or may

be made prior to the survey.

1st. In cases where the approved plat of

survey has not yet been returned, the declar-

atory statement must be filed within three

months after the receipt of such approval plat

at the District Office.

2nd. When the plat is now in the Register's

Office, the declaration must be filed within

three months from the first publication of this

circular in your land district. A failure to

comply with this requirement, will work afor-

iture of the claim.
