

NEBRASKA ELECTION. CASS COUNTY

The following are the official figures for Cass county. Plattsmouth, 75 Rep. majority—gain of 20 over October.

COLUMBUS

The vote in Columbus makes a tie, being a Republican gain of 45 since October.

OTOE COUNTY

In Nebraska City, the Republican gain is 61, and in two precincts we gain 30.

RICHARDSON COUNTY

We hear nothing from Richardson county except from Rulo, which gives a Republican majority of 23.

NEMAHA COUNTY

Brownville gives 153 Republican majority's gain of 52 since October.

SAKABY COUNTY

Bellevue precinct gives 11 Republican majority, a gain of 18 since October.

LAWNE COUNTY

Pawnee gives Grant a clean thing of 453 majority, a gain of 70 since October.

THE STATE

Indications are that the State will give at least 4,000 majority for Grant, a gain of 1,000.

THE ELECTION.

In reference to the telegraph dispatches in today's papers it will be seen that every northern State, except perhaps New York and New Jersey, has given a majority for Grant and Colfax.

A Republican takes the place of Van Wickie in the U. S. Senate from west Virginia.
