It would purchase a pavy of one hundred monitors, and two thousand war-vessels thoroughly equipped, the proudest armament that ever rade upon the seas It would build a national capital worth one hundred million dollars, and a cap ital for every State in the Union worth fifty millions. It would rear one hundred thousand h uses of worship. Spades, Shovels, Hoes, Rakes, at an expense of twenty thousand dol lars each. It would pay the expenseof all the religious, charitable, and be nevolent societies in our land, including the ministry, Bible, tract, missionary societies, etc., for the next fifty years, since all of these do not cost now over forty millions of dollars annually.
