

LETTER FROM OMAHA.

THE COUNTRY BETWEEN PLATTSMOUTH AND OMAHA.

OMAHA, Tuesday evening, June 28, 1871. DEAR HERALD:—This is a beautiful evening, and after a rest from a ride by back and rail, and the enjoyment of a good, square meal, I will endeavor to give you a jotting or two about our trip to this city.
