JUNE 26TH, 1872.

At the close of the oration, by Senator Tipton, the business of the meeting was entered into, and officers for the ensuing year were then nominated and elected, as follows:

The next Re-union will be at BROWNVILLE, on the first Wednesday in September, 1873.

Gen. JOHN M. THAYER was then selected as the Orator of the day.

Hon. John Gillespie called attention to the fact that an appropriation of money for memorial purposes had been voted to Nebraska, and some action ought to be taken on the matter.

Senator Tipton suggested that the next Re-union should be the proper time, and if it was so announced, a larger attendance would be given, and a more satisfactory disposal of the business arrived at.

Gen. Cunningham moved that a committee be appointed to attend to this matter, especially, this debate led to the passage of the second resolution, to which we call special attention.

Resolved, That the next Re-union be at Brownville, Neb., on the first Wednesday of September, 1873.

Resolved, That the President, Vice-President and Secretary, be, and are hereby constituted a committee to obtain, without delay, from the Ordnance Department at Washington, all the cannon appropriated to Nebraska for memorial purposes.

Resolved, That the soldiers of the war, now residents of Nebraska, be requested to organize in every county in the State, by electing an Executive Committee of five persons, the name of the chairman of such committees, being forwarded to the Secretary, Hon. John Gillespie, at Lincoln, Neb., without delay.

Resolved, That the Soldiers and Sailors, here present, offer their hearty thanks to the ladies and citizens of Plattsmouth, for the sumptuous and generous manner in which they were provided for, and for their courteous attention in waiting upon us.
