A great fire occurred in Baltimore on Friday the 25th. The loss is estimated at half a million dollars.

On account of the lateness of the harvest and the impossibility of getting the grounds in readiness, the Camp meeting in Elwood Grove, 18 miles east of Lincoln, on the M. P. R. R., has been postponed until Sept 9th.

Mr. Moses Stocking, of Saunders county, clipped over 10,000 pounds of wool this spring from his flock of 1,000 sheep.

There were six districts. The first district was taken by W. T. Sharp, and part of its boundaries reads like this: from the Mo. river west 100 miles beyond the Little Nemaha and the 40th parallel; it seems to have contained 832 inhabitants.

The Second District was around Brownville and old Ft. Kearney (Nebraska City). Chas. B. Smith took the census; there were 609 inhabitants by the best footings we can make.

The Third contained 327, and the first free colored gentlemen appear here. The Fourth took in Omaha and surrounding regions, and contained 709 inhabitants.

The Fifth was up about Fontenelle, and is set down for 123 persons. The Sixth was north of Ft. Calhoun, over in the Elkhorn, and counts up 139.

A Mr. Turner, near York, while chasing buffalo, was knocked over by one which he had wounded and in the melee his gun went off, wounding him in the shoulders.

The fellow Hamilton, noticed in our last issue as a swindler, has been arrested at Hiawatha.

A son of W. Krieg, grain dealer Lincoln, got his foot crushed in the turntable, at the depot, and had to have it amputated.

A man named Shultz living near Pleasant Hill, and working on his brother-in-law's farm, killed his sister, and then when pursued, cut his own throat. Reason unknown.

A herd of 2,700 Texas cattle have arrived at Beatrice, and other large herds are expected soon. So says the Express.

On July 17th, a young boy named Charles Magan, living ten miles from here was thrown from his pony and dragged several rods with one foot in the stirrup, and his head on the ground.

THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE ASSEMBLY OF THE TERRITORY OF NEBRASKA. Commenced at Omaha, on Tuesday, the 16th day of January, and ended on the 16th day of March, A. D. 1855.

At 10 A. M., the Council were called to order; H. P. Bennett, of Pierce county, President pro tem, and Isaac R. Alden, of Washington, clerk pro tem.

Sharp moved a Committee of three on Credentials; they were satisfactory it appears, and Jos. L. Sharp, of Cass, was elected first President of the first Council of the first Legislative Assembly in this Territory.

Geo. L. Miller had each 6 votes for Clerk, and the election was adjourned for several days. Samuel Marks, of Cass, acting as Clerk pro tem, on the first brought up again, Miller received 7 votes to Alden's 6, and was declared duly elected. Thus early does the name of G. L. Miller, now Editor of the Omaha Herald, appear upon the records of Nebraska.

O. F. Lake was elected Assistant Clerk, S. N. Lewis, Sergeant-at-Arms, and N. R. Folsom, doorkeeper, and the Council was fully organized.
