EPITOME OF THE WEEK. CONDENSED TELEGRAPHIC NEWS. The Massachusetts Prohibitionists have nominated John J. Baker for Governor. D. O. MILLS has been chosen President of the Bank of California under the new organization. The receipts from internal revenue for the fiscal year up to the 31st were \$29,289,087, and from customs \$44,425,714. The "Green House," near Westminister, England, valued with its contents at over \$2,500,000, has been totally destroyed by fire. The celebrated trotter "American Girl" dropped dead on the track while trotting a race at Elmira, N. Y., on the 2d. She was valued at \$30,000. The United States Assistant Treasurer at New York has been directed to sell \$1,000,000 in gold on each Thursday of the present month—\$4,000,000 in all. The peaches sent by the steamer Canada from New York to London arrived at the latter port on the 5th in good order, and met with ready sale at large prices. The New York Supreme Court has confirmed the decision of the lower court denying the motion to vacate the order of arrest on the \$6,000,000 suit against William M. Tweed and ordering \$3,000,000 bail. The Sublime Porte of Turkey has decreed that during five years from Jan. 1, 1876, the interest on and the redemption of the public debt will be paid one-half in cash and the other half in 5 per cent bonds. The bills have been found by the Grand Jury of the District of Columbia against Benjamin B. Halleck, William H. Otman and T. W. Brown for having been concerned in the \$47,000 robbery of the United States Treasury. The official canvass of the votes on the New Jersey constitutional amendments shows that all received a majority of more than 40,000 except the twelfth amendment, known as the "Five-County act," which received a majority of 6,734. A CAPE steamer which reached London on the 10th brought intelligence of the finding of a 150-carat diamond in the South African diamond fields. NEGOTIATIONS with the Sioux Indians for the Black Hills country have failed, and the commissioners have abandoned all efforts in this behalf. A Cheyenne disband of the 2d says great dissatisfaction prevailed among the bands of Indians who have assembled at the Red Cloud Agency. The Third Avenue Savings Bank of New York City has failed. Amount due depositors, \$1,340,000. The failure is said to be a bad one. A SAN SEBASTIAN dispatch of the 4th says the Carlists have offered to discontinue the bombardment of the town provided the citizens would pay them \$100,000. The steamer L. J. Bagot, running on the Pacific between Lubec and Copenhagen, was burned on the night of the 3d. Twenty-four passengers and eleven seamen perished. A RELIGIOUS procession in Toronto on Sunday, the 3d, was attacked by a mob, and when the police attempted to disperse the mob, the assailants turned upon them and firing resulted in several persons being wounded. The police then guarded the procession through the streets and were fired upon at the crossings, and several other persons were wounded, some of them fatally. DISPATCHES of the 4th give accounts of a horrible outrage and murder at Suncook, N. H. The mutilated body of a young woman, Miss Josie Longmaid, seventeen years old, had been found in a piece of woods half a mile from the road over which she had started in the morning to go to school. The head was missing, having been entirely severed from the body. MEMORIAL services in honor of the late President Johnson were held at Nashville, Tenn., on the 3d, and were participated in by citizens from many portions of the State. At the recent town elections in Connecticut the larger places generally voted for liquor license and the smaller towns were about equally divided on the question. Hartford gave 1,100 and East Hartford 2 majority for license and Danbury voted no license. VICE-PRESIDENT WILSON has been counseled by his medical advisers to abandon his intention to lecture this season, as it would prove too serious a strain on his constitution if undertaken in addition to his official duties and the completion of his book. An immense meeting to protest against Vaneven was held at Glasgow, Scotland, on the 5th. The taxes remitted by Turkey since the beginning of the trouble with its Christian provinces amount to over \$30,000,000. The American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions of the Congregational Church met in Chicago on the 5th. The attendance was large, representatives to the number of over 1,000 being present from all the States in the Union and from Canada. The Comptroller of the Currency has called upon National Banks for a report exhibiting their condition at the close of business on Friday, the 1st of October. It was reported on the 7th that the inhabitants of Arran Valley had inaugurated a general rising against the Carlists on account of the exactions of the soldiers, and that the latter had been compelled to take refuge in the mountains. The epizootic in a mild form has broken out among the horses in Cincinnati, Chicago, St. Louis and other Western cities. MEMPHIS dispatches of the 6th report serious disturbances as having occurred at Friar's Point, Miss. It is stated that a crowd of about 100 persons gathered on the night of the 2d Senator Alcorn reversed, criticized and very far from the fact. Marriage is one of the things that does not get regulated by prices current, and the less people have of worldly goods the more reason there is for their joining hands to get and save. In the skirmish which took place on the 5th a white woman was fatally wounded and three negroes were killed and one wounded, probably fatally. Senator Alcorn on the 7th sent a dispatch to Atty-Gen. Pierpont stating that there was no question of politics in these disturbances; the whites were to be a man for a defense, and the negroes who had been misled were fast being reconciled.
