CURRENT PARAGRAPHS. THE Freeport (Ill.) watch-factory was recently destroyed by an incendiary fire. Loss \$150,000.

GEN. SOL MEREDITH, of Indiana, died recently at his home in Cambridge City, of a cancer in his stomach.

JAMES E. DANHAM, Postmaster at Bridgeport, Conn., has been suspended by the President for having sold appointments.

W. PERKINS, an English pedestrian, has accomplished the feat of walking eight miles in an hour—the quickest time on record.

INFORMATION has recently been received at Washington that Russia will be represented at the American Centennial next year.

ARTHUR DAVIS and wife, of Toronto, Canada, have been sentenced to be hanged in December next for the murder of Miss Gilman by malpractice.

THE vote polled in Cincinnati at the recent election was the largest ever cast in that city, being 99,530. The vote in the county was about 47,000.

THE Governor of Alabama has appointed Nov. 16 as the day for the people to vote upon the new Constitution.

THE property bequeathed by the will of the late Isaac M. Singer, the sewing-machine man, amounts in value to \$14,000,000.

THE receipts of the Postoffice Department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1875, were \$27,561,592.88, expenditures, \$33,611,309.45—leaving a deficiency balance of \$6,049,806.77.

THE Texas Constitutional Convention has adopted a provision making the Governor's term four years, and providing that no person shall be eligible for more than one term in eight years.

IN consequence of the Pope's intercession the Emperor of Germany has remitted one year of Cardinal Ledochowski's term of imprisonment for resisting the Prussian Ecclesiastical laws, and a full pardon will probably follow.

EPITOME OF THE WEEK. CONDENSED TELEGRAPHIC NEWS. RETURNS (many of them unofficial) received at Columbus on the 15th from all the countries in Ohio give Hayes a majority of 4,753 over Allen, and a Republican majority of seventeen in the House and three in the Senate.

THE King of Bavaria has issued a royal decree adjourning the Bavarian Diet until further notice. The King refused to accept the resignation of his Ministers.

A LARGE mass-meeting of citizens in favor of the reading of the Bible in the public schools was held in New York City on the evening of the 20th.

AT Denver, Col., on the 21st, the bodies of four Italian musicians (an old man and three boys) were found in a cellar of the house they had occupied, with their throats cut from ear to ear.

A BREMEN special of the 17th says that Russia has demanded the Polish property in the provinces of Mlita, Kozna, Kooma, Minsk and Vitepsk to sell their farms to Russian tenantry.

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
