It seems that the local celebrations of the Fourth of July, 1876, which will be held through out the land, should be made to contribute to a permanent historical record of the Centennial celebration. An excellent provision should be made for the delivery of an address tracing the history of that particular community for the past century, or from the time of its settlement, and including a sketch of its growth, its resources, industries, prospects, etc. These addresses should be published in a uniform size—that of the Congressional documents, for instance—in order that they may be bound together by States. To competent persons the preparation of such essays would not be a really burdensome task, but by aggregating they would constitute an invaluable historical repository such as no nation has ever had the opportunity to collect.

Designations of the historians ought to be made without delay, in order that they may have time to accomplish their work. It is to be hoped that the press will give general circulation to the project, and that each journal will see to its contribution in its own locality, and that the slight expense involved be assumed by the county or town authorities.
