Attorneys and officers of the law will be neld responsible for all legal notices they hand in, and all parties demanding a proof of publication of any notice will be held for the publica-tion fee of such notice.

1. Any person who takes the paper regularly from the post-office, whether directed to his imme, or whether he is a subsective or not—is respectively be for the pay.

2. If any person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrearages, or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, and collect the whole amount, whether the private is taken from the office or not.

3. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers and periodicals from the post office, or removing and leaving them uncalled for, is prima facic exidence of intentional.
