## State Board of Agriculture

### Secretary's Office, Plattsmouth, Ne

The rates on passengers, stock and freight, over the different railroads in the State, to and from the Nebraska State Fair, to be held at Lincoln, Sept. 8-12, 1879, are as follows:

**B. & M. R. R. IN NEB. & C. B. & Q. R. R. AND LEASED LINES.**

All parties going to Lincoln to attend the State Fair, will be carried at three-fifths fare for the round trip, first class tickets being good for forty days over the C. B. & Q., from principal points in Illinois and Iowa.

**ON B. & M. R. R. IN NEB. AND LEASED LINES.**

All farm products to be billed to the Fair free and returned free.

Stock, hogs, cattle or horses for exhibition billed with charges prepaid to Fair, and returned free and charges to Fair refunded in usual way, on certificate of the Secretary of State Board that stock was on exhibition.

Trotting stock, full rates one way, returning free on certificate of Secretary.

Passengers, one fare for round trip from all points in the State, during the whole of Fair week.

Excursion trains will be run on three days of the Fair, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, between Omaha, Plattsmouth and Lincoln, round trip \$2.00, including admission to the Fair. Leaving Omaha at 8 a. m., Plattsmouth 8:30 a. m., reaching Lincoln at 11:30. Returning, leave Lincoln at 6 p. m., and Fair grounds at 6:10.

**SIOUX CITY & PACIFIC R. R.**

Half rates on freight for exhibition and excursion tickets from Nebraska Division Stations, to Blair or Fremont and return, at one and one-fifth fare, and from Iowa Division Stations, to Missouri Valley and return, at one and one-fourth fare, round trip.

Full rates on freights going to the Fair, and returned free upon certificate of Secretary; no change in ownership taking place.

Excursion tickets will be sold September 5-11, inclusive, and be good until the 15th.

**ST. JOSEPH & DENVER CITY R. R.**

From all points on the line to Troy Junction, or Hastings, round trip tickets, one full fare.

Machinery, stock, &c., for exhibition, from any station on the line to Troy Junction or Hastings, full rates one way, to be returned free upon proper

certificate of Secretary.

**ATCHISON & NEBRASKA**

Rates for passage during Sept. 8-12, at Lincoln, will be one-fifth fare for round trip.

Live stock, machinery, merchandise, fruit, &c., will be charged regular rates one way and returned free, if they do not change ownership.

**OMAHA & NORTHERN NEBRASKA**

Passengers carried at half rate for all live stock, merchandise, machinery, &c., for exhibition, regular rates one way but returned free on certificate from the Secretary.

**UNION PACIFIC R. R.**

Passengers will be charged regular rates from Fremont and Wahoo to Plattsmouth and return, \$2.75 from Colfax to Plattsmouth, \$3.50 from Clay City to Plattsmouth, \$5.00 from Grand Island, \$5.00 from Plattsmouth to North Platte, \$17.35 from Plattsmouth to Omaha. Proportionate rates from other points. This includes ticket to the Fair.

Live Stock, goods, machinery, &c., will be charged regular rates one way to the Fair. If shipped from any point within one week from the Fair by the same party and to the same point, they will be returned free of charge to such point, if in the State of Nebraska on certificate of Secretary that they have been on exhibition.

**NEBRASKA STATE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY, WITH STATE FAIR**

The Nebraska State Horticultural Society will hold its annual Fair at Plattsmouth, Sept. 10, 11 and 12, 1879. It is hoped that the Horticulturists of the State will exercise of their customary energy and zeal, see that Pomological Societies in Nebraska, in keeping with their characterized liberality on such occasions, will transport fruits for exhibition free. To obtain these accommodations, direct to Dan'l H. Wheeler, Secretary, Lincoln, with the inscription, "Fruits for Exhibition at State Fair."
