A Pretty Story.

Here is one of those pretty stories that appeal to the superstitious in the nature of even the most practical, and which Hawthorne would have delighted to possess for his note-book as the basis of some future "sketch." M. Paquet, a medalist in the service of the French Government, as the story goes, was in 1835 commissioned to execute a medal bearing the head of Lincoln. It was early in April that M. Paquet, while carefully watching the progress of his work, perceived one morning a crack in the die extending across the temple. The Government authorities, pleased with the excellence of the likeness, ordered Mr. Paquet to finish the medal in spite of the blemish. A few hours later President Lincoln was shot, and strangely enough Booth's bullet took almost exactly the course of the crack across the medal portrait.
