CAPITAL REMOVAL.

A bill was introduced in the house of representatives yesterday, for the removal of the capital to some point within the counties of Colfax, Platte, Polk, Merrick, Hamilton, Hall, Adams, Buffalo, and Kearney. It is generally conceded that a very large majority of the members of the legislature are in favor of the removal, but there is a difference of opinion as to the manner of doing it.
