Webster County Contained.

Webster Co., Neb., lies in the Valley of the Republican, in the valley west of the Missouri River and touches the state line on the South. Winters are mild and dry, very little rain or snow falls in that season, the little rain that falls in winter with no hay or grain. Plenty of rain falls in the spring and summer. The summer is not disagreeably warm, as there is always a cool breeze especially in the evenings. The county first began to be settled in 1851. In 1851 the county was organized with a population of 3,700. The population has since increased to 25,000. There are in the county 23 organized school districts within its boundaries and school facilities are therefore ample better than those in some Eastern States. The agricultural school land furnished nearly enough money to pay teachers' wages. Farmers can have a good land from \$100 to \$200 per acre with very few trees. There is a considerable amount of government land for homestead and pre-emption. A good stock raising country it is hard to exceed. Cattle do well, and for sheep it cannot be beaten. It is not suited for that. Fortunes can be easily made by raising a sheep as the expense of feeding is very small. That corn, oats, barley, potatoes, buckwheat, and all kinds of fruits and vegetables are grown here with little labor. It has been found corn to be the most profitable crop. Wheat averages about 25 bushels to the acre. Fruit does extremely well. Every farmer has his orchard growing. Forest trees grow rapidly. Cotton-wood, boxelder, white-bird, soft maple, and many other kinds of trees grow into timber land enough for an acre in three years. These trees furnish fuel, and in a few years will furnish lumber. The county is well watered by the Republican and its tributaries, which are as follows: on the south side of the river, Walnut, Dry, Buffalo, state, Perry, Cedar, Ticks, Ash, and Guide Rock creeks. On the north side of the river are the Indian, Cheyenne, and Blue creeks. In the north part of the county is the Blue river and its tributaries.

The soil of Webster county is a dark, rich vegetable loam. The soil grasses are nutritious and abundant, and make good pasturage for hay. Family stores of grain will grow here, and will abundantly produce a profitable production. Those who have tried them do so cheerfully.

Our railroad routes are good, and we will have a road as soon as we really need it. We are favored for grain, will grow better than any other production in the power of man to make and new settlers. By the time these markets are closed roads for cheaper transportation east will be opened.

Our climate is healthful, the air pure and bracing, and it knows of any kind it is stronger to the people here.

The county seat, **RED CLOUD**, lies in the Republican river, near the center east and west and a little south of the center north and south. It is a favorite place for business men of every branch of trade. The county around it is so well watered and has all the best kind of merchandise.
