TO NOMINATE CANDIDATES FOR STATE OFFICES.

The Republican electors of the State of Nebraska are hereby called to send delegates from the several counties to meet in State Convention at Lincoln, on Tuesday, the 25th day of September, 1876, for the purpose of placing in nomination a candidate for member of Congress, and candidates for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor, Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Attorney General, and Land Commissioner, and to transact such other business as may properly come before it.

There will be a Republican County Convention on the 13th day of May at Red Cloud, for the purpose of electing two delegates to the State Convention to be held at Fremont on the 23rd for the purpose of sending delegates to the National Convention at Cincinnati.

Hayes, though comparatively a young man, has made for himself a record worthy of the oldest politician. In the doubtful State of Ohio, he has vanquished the two acknowledged leaders of the democratic party, Thurman and Allen, and has been regarded as the tower of strength for the Republicans in that state.
