A BILL has been introduced to abolish the office of County Superintendent. And meets with considerable support.

The compromise bill now before Congress, provides that the two Houses shall elect five Judges of the Supreme Court, and five members from each house shall proceed to canvass the electoral vote and decide who shall be President. This vote has heretofore been vested in the Speaker of the House. There is grave doubt of the constitutionality of the bill. We hope it will not pass.

Is referring to the passage of the bill for counting the electoral vote Gov. Hayes says: "I want it distinctly understood that I do not desire to influence the action of Congress in any way or the other in the matter of the electoral bill, or any other matter relative to the Presidential election. The whole thing is in the hands of Congress, and I shall be content with its action."

It strikes us that the resolutions introduced by Senator Van Wyck, amending the law in reference to the purchase of tax-titles are sound. The 40 per cent. interest which goes to the speculating tax shark who lies in waiting to take advantage of a poor man's necessity, ought to be condemned. Laws should be made to protect the farmers as much as possible rather than to assist the monied aristocrats in grinding them out of home and happiness.

Tilden has been sued in the U. S. District Court for \$150,000, non-payment of income tax. Attorney Bliss uses the following positive language in this connection: "I am thoroughly convinced that Mr. Tilden has not paid the income tax which the law required, and he should therefore be compelled to pay."

It will be remembered that Mr. Blaine in one of his Ohio speeches stated that he was convinced, and that he spoke under the authority of United States officers, that Mr. Tilden had been guilty of withholding his just dues to the government, and of swearing to a false return of his income.

Congress declares its inability to tell a fraudulent "paper purporting to be a certificate" from a duly authenticated document, according to law, and to count the Presidential vote, or to let the constitutional officer count the same, and have left it out to "arbitration." But as the constitution don't say anywhere that this little job shall be left to arbitration, as the principals in the business, Messrs. Hayes and Wheeler, and Messrs. Tilden and Hendricks, are not parties to the appointment of the arbitration board, it will be suddenly found when the decision is rendered: that arbitration don't arbitrate in this instance, and there will be, if Mr. Hayes is declared elected, as much "war" declared and "gnash" shed as before this brilliant dodge was thought of.—Journal.
