We publish elsewhere the grasshopper act, as passed by the last session of the Nebraska legislature. It provides that the road supervisors shall call upon the able-bodied men of their respective districts to spend not less than two days, nor more than ten, in the exterminating sport of destroying grasshoppers. The act does not, we believe, provide any means by which the festive hopper may be caught preparatory to "shuffling off" his "mortal coil,"—leaving it, we suppose, to the ingenuity of the road masters to devise means with which to entrap them. In the eastern part of the State there has been numerous grasshopper meetings held in nearly all of the counties which were largely attended by the farmers, and quite an interest worked up. The average Nebraska depend almost entirely on machinery to do his work; so when the question of grasshopper extermination was brought on, the first cry that was raised was for "a mashene!"

A petition was accordingly presented to the county commissioners of Cass county, asking that a reward be offered for the best machine for the destruction of grasshoppers. The commissioners offered a reward of \$50, and at last accounts every farmer who could buy or borrow a jack-knife and meat axe, was diligently at work constructing guillotines with which to behead the despoilers of their crops. So far as we know the farmers of this county are not making any preparations to give the hoppers a warm reception, and it is a question in our mind, whether or not, in this sparsely settled country, they can be successfully combated. In our opinion, the only way the little hoppers can be destroyed is the burning of the prairie grass just after they have hatched, and in sections where the grass is already burned off, we do not see how they are to be successfully fought again.
