PROCLAMATION.

BY THE GOVERNOR.

The citizens of this Commonwealth
have enjoyed a year of general health
and prosperity, and a harvest unusu-
ally bountiful. We have escaped the
blight of plague, the visitation of pes-
tilence, and the woe of public calamity.
It is befitting a grateful people to
make due acknowledgement to the
Supreme Ruler for these signal bless-
ings.

Therefore, I SILAS GARDNER, Gov-
ernor of the State of Nebraska, mind-
ful of a time-honored custom, and in
conformity with the proclamation of the
President of the United States, do
heretby appoint
TUESDAY, THE 29th DAY OF NOV.
A. D. 1877.

as a day of prayer and public Thank-
sgiving to Almighty God. And I re-
quest good citizens to abstain, as far
as practicable, from their accustomed
pursuits, and observe the day designat-
ed in a manner becoming a Chris-
tian and prosperous community.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my
hand and caused the Great
Seal of the State of Ne-
braska to be affixed. Done
at Lincoln the Eighth Day
of November, in the year
of our Lord One Thousand
Eight Hundred and seven-
ty-seven, and of the Inde-
pendence of the United
States the One Hundred
and Second, and of this
State the Eleventh.

By the Governor, SILAS GARDNER.

We commend the following pro-
clamation by the governor of Rhode
Island for its brevity and comprehen-
siveness: "I appoint Thursday, the
29th inst., as Thanksgiving day, and
request the people of this state to as-
semble in their houses for public wor-
ship and return thanks to God for his
tender mercies and loving kindness;
and may those who are blessed with
abundance give liberally to the poor."
