

THE NATIONAL PARTY.
Plan of Uniform Organization.
To the People of United States:
Owing to the pressing demands from all parts of the country for the immediate organization of the National party, the executive committee of the National party of the United States has adopted the following plan of action, out of which it is believed will grow a perfect and uniform organization of the party in the different States.

Upon the application of ten or more voters who have organized a council of the National party in any locality, and elected officers, consisting of a chief, vice-chief, a scribe and a treasurer, and reported the State, postoffice, township and county, or city and ward, in which it is organized, together with the names of the said officers, the National committee will issue to such organization an engraved charter, emblematic of the principles and objects of the National party, and a constitution and directions for the organization and government of the council. Each application must be accompanied by the sum of one dollar. This sum will cover the expense of issuing the charter, and will secure to each council the privilege of obtaining printed documents, badges, campaign song books, and other campaign goods at cost, or as near cost as practicable, from the National committee.
