

**STARS FROM THE BEAR.**  
 The State Medical Society met at Fremont Tuesday, June 4-6.  
 The prospects are good for a large yield of wheat along the Platte.  
 The last day of Dr. St. Louis' monthly existence is set for September 1st.  
 Contracts are to be let for building a 21-mile track from Hastings to Red Cloud, distance 41 miles.  
 Mr. Richardson of Red Cloud, shipped sixteen car loads of hogs from Omaha to Chicago, on Tuesday last.  
 Governor Garber has offered a reward of \$200 each for the arrest of the members of L. J. Holbrook, Herndon and the two Sutcliffe Brothers found dead on the Diamond some weeks ago.  
 About two weeks ago a young man stole a horse from a settler near Red Cloud, was overtaken after a run of 200 miles on his own horse, the thief, and, resisting, a fight ensued, in which the thief was wounded, too severely to be brought back, and was left on the prairie 30 miles from the nearest house.  
 Strawberries, the first of the season were picked on the 20th ult. at Lincoln.  
 Franklin county is quietly making preparations for the coming state and district fairs, expecting to again come out as the banner county.  
 Fred Nye of Fremont has started a new evening daily in Chicago, which he has christened the Omaha Era.  
 The district agricultural society of this district is having 3,000 copies of the "premium list printed. Wright has the job, a guarantee for its good execution.  
 The "Nebraska Exposition Association" of Lincoln has been incorporated. The object is to purchase and lease the state fair grounds which will be sold by the University Regents to meet the obligations for the model farm which was bought in the sale of the fair grounds. The capital in stock needed is \$35,000, in 140 shares. One half the stock has been taken, and the remainder should be subscribed on or before the 10th of June. It is the understanding that this company will, whenever the Lancaster County Agricultural Society can purchase the grounds, transfer it at the same figures, so that it will be public property.  
 The Growing Crop.  
 (Omaha Republican.)  
 The National Board of Trade published in Chicago, gives special attention to crop reports throughout the country, all of which have a bearing on the Nebraska market. We condense the following from this date in the issue of May 23, some twenty counties having reported.  
 Boone County—Spring grain looks remarkably well, farmers much encouraged by the general outlook. Large demand for surplus crop.  
 Clay—Fall wheat and rye headed out, wheat heavy on the ground, barley and oats the same; corn up.  
 Colfax—Every available piece of land being cultivated. Prospects all favorable for a large field of small grain.  
 Dodge—The condition of all grains good.  
 Cass—All small grains looking well; corn coming up with fair stand.  
 Franklin—All small grains looking very fine, corn all planted and coming up finely.  
 Hall—Spring grains never looked better; wheat and oats splendid; corn coming well; everybody breaking prairie.  
 Knox—Small grains look fine; corn about planted; straw being all right.  
 Morrill—Wheat, oats and potatoes good; double the acreage of wheat sown; more prairie will be broken this year than any previous one; good stand of corn.  
 Platte—Crops are in excellent condition.  
 Seward—Spring wheat, oats and barley look well; winter rye headed and will be out in twenty days.  
 Here is enough to show the state of Nebraska crops. There is no complaint, as in Iowa, of oblique bugs and frost; in Kansas, of rust and sick; in Indiana and Illinois of rust. The above news we get from abroad, depending on an eastern paper for home news. Have we still a State Agricultural Society whose duty it should be to see that the "true facts" are at least monthly put before the public? We have not yet seen any report of arbor day. The people here want their children friends to know what we are doing in forest growing and orchard planting. The press of the State are always anxious to publish such facts for the good of Nebraska.
