Premium List of the Webster County Agricultural Society for 1878. The Exhibition to be held at Red Cloud September 17, 18, 19.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Superintendents of classes will take particular direction of all articles in their respective departments, and shall appoint awarding committees in their respective classes under the direction and with the consent of the Board of directors. Judges will not be permitted to serve upon a committee in any class in which they may be competing for a premium. Judges will not award any animal or article a premium unless in their opinion it is decidedly meritorious. Judges will not permit any person to interfere in their deliberations. Competitors attempting to interfere with committees will forfeit their right to a premium. Animals or articles entered in one class or sub-class, shall not compete in another except in case of sweepstakes or general display. Red ribbon or card denotes 1st premium. Blue ribbon or card denotes 2d premium. All \$2 premiums awarded in 1878 are payable in Nebraska Farmer for one year and all \$1 premium in Nebraska Farmer 6 months except where more than one such premium is awarded the same individual, in such instance, it shall be optional with the person to whom award is made, whether more than one copy of the paper be taken.

The committee will report according and the board of directors will designate the amount of premiums to be awarded in each case where premiums are recommended.

CLASS ELEVEN. VEGETABLES.

Superintendent, James Vick. For the purpose of encouraging the culture and love of flowers, I authorize the officers of every county society in America to offer one of my floral chronicles for the best exhibition of cut flowers. The offer is made to amateurs only, and the flowers to be exhibited at the regular annual fair. The awards to be made by the regular judges, or by any committee appointed for that purpose. The flowers not to be made up in bouquets but exhibited separate and named.

CLASS TWELVE. DISCRETIONARY.

Superintendent, James Vick. This is the last time we can publish the premium list in the paper. Preserve this copy, and remember what the premiums are. The Society needs the help of every farmer in the county, and it should be the pride of the farmers to make the society the best in the valley. We have the best grounds in the valley and we ought to have it fenced and otherwise protected, also some kind of ornamentation. The hall though quite large, was not large enough last year to furnish room for everything that was on exhibition. The society needs another building as large as that, but in order to make all these improvements, we must take hold of the matter in earnest. Every one would consider himself in duty bound to do something for the success of the Fair. We shall be able to present the society with a really priced premium list in pamphlet form, about the first of July, and to hope that all will second our efforts to make the County Fair of 1878, the BEST.
