-Wahoo is making a good showing of new buildings.  
-The Edgar falls have had a cemetery laid out for them.  
-Hogs weighing 600 pounds are no rarity in the York market.  
-The Humboldt are sending buyers are doing a brisk business.  
-The strangers in Red Cloud out number the old residents many times.  
-The railroad is having all the business it can attend to at Nebraska City.  
-New buildings are during the prairie in all directions around Geneva.  
-South Bend wants a bridge across the Platte to insure its greater prosperity.  
-A Party of New Yorkers, with their families, will locate soon in Dawson county.  
-Two men shot forty wild geese before breakfast near Clarksville the other morning.  
-Hastings is seriously contemplating the erection of packing houses at no distant day.  
-There is only one criminal case in Otoe county for the December term of the district court.  
-Prairie schooners continue to sail around over the prairie regardless of the approaching winter.  
-It is now denied that two men were shot in the Loup county for setting out prairie fire.  
-The cattle shipped from Plum Creek this season up to the 21st inst. number 5 468-263 our load.
