The Bloomington Guard copied our
article on class legislation, last week
and gave us the following "send off"
for which appreciation of our humble
efforts we feel thankful, and which
shows that the Guard keeps its eyes
open and is a live local paper. The
Guard says: By way of a little digres-
sion, we will add, that a few years ago
the County office was about as has
looking office as we ever want into,
and the Argus could come in about
that time, bright and new, from the
foundry, making a handsome ap-
pearance, and on the strength of
which, evidently expected an easy
walk away with the County, and long
ago. Comparing the two pa-
pers to-day we cannot help notice
that whatever discernible contrast
there may be, the appearance is in
favor of the CHIEF.

The old moss-back who edits the
concern at the lower end of town wants
us to point out one particular screw in
the county machinery that it loose. We
cheerfully comply, and call the afore-
said moss-back's attention to the fact
that he charged this county at the
rate of thirty dollars per thousand for
summons for Co. Judge, and swore
that the bill was "just and true and
wholly unpaid," considering that
summons, such as was furnished by
him cost \$8.00 per thousand later
down here, we think that there is a
"screw loose somewhere." Whether
the County clerk gets a share of the
funds thus stolen from the people of
the county, we have no means of find-
ing out. But this we do know; the law
requires that the clerk shall let the
contract for furnishing the county
with stationery to the lowest bidder,
and we know that he has disregarded
the law notwithstanding the fact that
it has been published in the CHIEF on
two different occasions and his atten-
tion called to it. And we know,
further, that if the clerk would comply
with the law and let the contract to
the lowest bidder, blanks that now
cost the county at the rate of \$30.00
per thousand would be furnished for
less than \$12.00 per thousand. The
summons, that are furnished the coun-
ty are but a small matter, they are but
one little item, but as we were only
asked by the Argus editor to point out
one little screw that was loose we will
drop the matter for the present, with
the assurance that we can point out other
screws that are loose if we are called
upon. In conclusion it might not be
out of place to say that we do not ask
any one to take our word for the state-
ment above made but to call for the bill
and examine it themselves. We saw
the bill containing the item above re-
ferred to last Saturday, it was allowed
on the 9th day of August, 1880.
We might call attention to other out-
rageous charges in the same bill but
this is enough for the present. This
may safely be taken down as one reason
why tax payers are so angry and we per-
haps will see some one suggesting
that the substance of the tax payers of
this county are so angry that they are
ready to stick a pin in the eye of any
man who dares to suggest that they
are not paying their taxes.
