The CHIEF received a letter last week from the News Editor of the New York Times, making inquiries as to the Chief's prospect in this county. Mr. C. W. Springer, to whom the matter was referred, and who has visited all parts of the county, the present spring, forwarded the following inquiries which may be of interest to our readers:

Red Cloud, Neb., April 20, 1882. J. C. BIRD, News Editor, New York Times, Dear Sir:—Your letter of April 12th addressed to the editor of the Chief has been handed me to answer. In my travels over the county I have made some observations regarding growing crops and the prospects for the future, and the result is, I can order that this part of Nebraska has never had a more flattering prospect for a good crop than it has now. The corn with wheat and clover, and the early sowing is up just growing finely. The late rains have helped it greatly, and the warm weather of the last few days is doing great things for it. For the past two years it has been a very tight crop, owing in 1880 to business in growing on account of dry weather, and in 1881 to drought after it began to grow. There is fully as large an acreage in some localities, while in others there is not, owing to the lack of seed. Oats are doing well, coming up evenly and entirely. There is no winter wheat of any account here. Rye did well last winter and its early start between a good crop. Nothing winter killed last winter. Timothy and clover though but little sown as yet, look well, and the sward is becoming well formed. Considerable barley will be sown as it is considered a paying crop. Plowing for corn is going on bravely now. A few have planted early corn which is coming up. Peas, lettuce, radishes and a few small sorts of potatoes are growing finely. A large acreage of corn will be put in this year, rather more than last year. Broom corn will be planted in some sections quite extensively. These are the crops that are doing best, and yielding the most. A late season profit for labor performed. The fruit is looking well, peaches though somewhat injured by the late cold weather will make a partial crop. Cherries are budding unusually thick this spring. Apples are slow and not much promise. Blackberries, raspberries, gooseberries and currants are putting out leaves to the terminal bud and promise a good crop.
