Articles of incorporation of the State Bank of Red Cloud, Nebraska. ARTICLE I. We, the undersigned, Lewis Moore, J. W. Sherwood, Albert V. Shirey, R. V. Shirey, of Red Cloud, Webster county, Nebraska...

Article II. The name of this corporation shall be the State Bank of Red Cloud, and its place of doing business shall be at Red Cloud, Webster county, Nebraska.

Article III. The capital stock of this corporation shall be Five Hundred Dollars, to be paid in under the direction of the directors of said bank, and be divided into shares of One Hundred Dollars each.

Article IV. The commencement of this corporation shall be October 15th A. D. 1882, and shall continue to the first day of January, A. D. 1890, and may be renewed from time to time indefinitely.

Article V. The business of this corporation shall be controlled and managed by a President, vice-President, Cashier and a board of five directors three of whom shall be a quorum.

Article VI. The corporation shall contract no indebtedness whatever outside of its obligations, and regular deposits received in the course of business and the drawing of exchange.

Article VII. The corporation may enact and adopt by laws as it may deem proper and necessary from time to time by a majority vote of all its directors.

Article VIII. The business of this corporation shall be to transact all ordinary banking business to receive moneys on deposit to discount bills and notes to loan money, to buy and sell exchange and securities of whatever kind, and do all things pertaining to a general banking business.

Article IX. The organization of the bank shall be complete and perfect upon the filing of these articles of incorporation in the office of the county clerk of Webster county Nebraska for the remainder of the year 1882...
