## The Situation.

Blaine, from Maine, seems to have a pretty good following in the United States. He has been endorsed by one or more state conventions and will make a good run before the Chicago convention. Arthur and Logan are still coming to the front with good backing from several states. The Chicago convention promises to be one of great interest, and it seems to be the prevailing opinion that a "dark horse" will win the laurels. On the democratic side of the house, Samuel J. Tilden holds the winning card, and will in all probability be the democratic standard bearer for 1884. Several other lesser lights in the democratic ranks are "bobbing up serenely" but do not seem to have the support that Samuel J. has among the newspapers in the various states.

## The District Republican Convention.

On last Tuesday the republicans of the second congressional district met in convention at Hastings for the purpose of putting in nomination two delegates to the Chicago convention and two alternates. At 7:30 p. m. the meeting was called to order, and Mr. F. L. Foss, of Saline county, was made chairman, and Captain Winterstein, secretary. Captain Scott, of York county, was then nominated for delegate and was elected by acclamation with tremendous cheering and the utmost enthusiasm. The captain on being called made a very neat and praiseworthy speech, after which Geo. B. Burton, of Harlan county, was nominated and elected by acclamation. A speech by Mr. Burton and the convention proceeded to elect alternates, the result of which was the selection of T. H. Matters, of Clay county, and F. A. Sweezy, of Blue Hill. After a few more enthusiastic speeches were made, resolutions endorsing President Arthur for his able administration were adopted. The convention was composed of Blaine delegations in most every case, and were extraordinary enthusiastic at the mention of the "plumed knight's" name. The selection of Mr. Burton and Mr. Sweezy was right and proper, as it gives the west end of the district proper recognition. Mr. Sweezy is a gentleman of ability and should the duty of voting fall upon him, we know that it would be done well and to the satisfaction of his constituency.

Organization of the Red Cloud Building Association of Red Cloud, Nebraska.

**ARTICLE I.**  
WE, CHARLES PLATT, D. H. KALEY, C. S. SHREY, L. H. WALLACE, and John E. Strey, all of Red Cloud, Webster county, Neb., do hereby incorporate ourselves and all persons who may become stockholders hereof, into a body corporate for the purpose of erecting, furnishing and maintaining an opera house in Red Cloud, Webster county, Nebraska, under the general incorporation laws of the state of Nebraska.

**ARTICLE II.**—The name of this corporation shall be "The Red Cloud Building Association," and its place of doing business shall be at Red Cloud, Webster county, Nebraska.

**ARTICLE III.**—The capital stock of this corporation shall be an authorized capital of \$200,000, to be paid in under the direction of the board of directors of said corporation and be divided into shares of ten dollars each.

**ARTICLE IV.**—The commencement of this corporation shall be April 15, 1884, and shall continue to the first day of January, 1885, and may be renewed from time to time indefinitely.

**ARTICLE V.**—The business of this corporation shall be controlled and managed by a president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer, and board of five directors, three of whom shall be a quorum. The directors shall be elected at a regular meeting to be held annually on the first Wednesday after the first Monday in January, by the stockholders, each share of stock entitling the holder thereof to vote, and at the same time, or at any adjourned meeting thereof. The directors shall elect a president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, all of whom shall remain in office until their successors are elected. The president shall be elected from the board of directors.

**ARTICLE VI.**—The indebtedness of the corporation shall at no time exceed two-thirds of the capital stock which is paid.

**ARTICLE VII.**—The corporation may enact and adopt by-laws as it may deem proper and necessary from time to time by a majority vote of all its directors.

**ARTICLE VIII.**—The business of this corporation shall be to erect an opera house, erecting, buying and selling such other property as it may deem proper.

**ARTICLE IX.**—The organization of this corporation shall be complete and perfect upon the filing of the articles of incorporation in the office of the county clerk of Webster county, Nebraska. For the remainder of the year C. Platt shall be president, D. H. Kaley shall be vice-president, L. H. Wallace shall be treasurer, and John E. Strey shall be secretary.

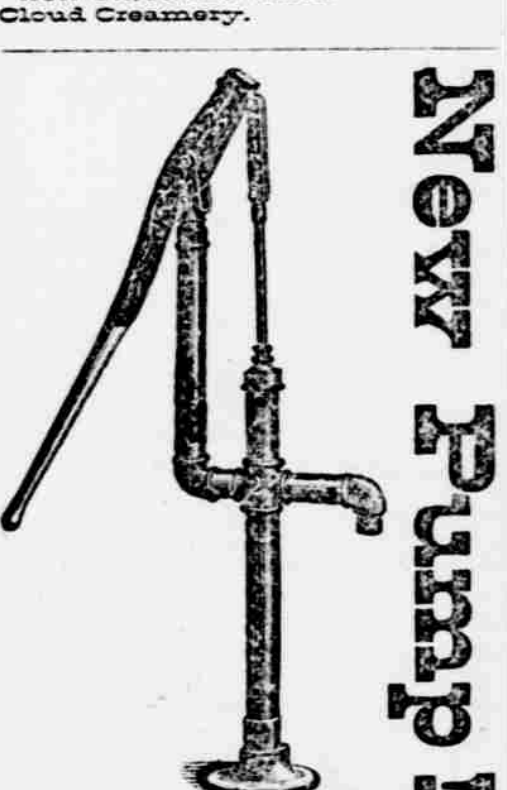
