English Beef Steamer

Take any kind of beef that can be chopped fine, better if you use a little suet, or you can put in butter if you like. 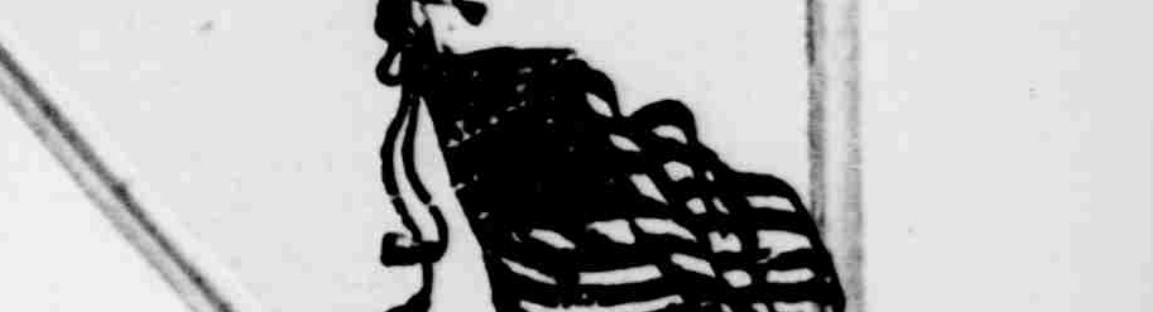
