

TURKEY'S FATE.

Expulsion From Europe Appears To Be Inevitable.

The Situation Difficult, Russia Actively Backing Bulgaria and the Other Powers Passive, For the Present at Least—Possibilities.

LONDON, October 4.—Diplomatic opinion tells capital is unanimous that Turkey must yield. If the Sultan gives way without fighting he will prove himself a wiser man than the caliph of 1877, who waged a bloody war and lost all the defensive barriers of the Turkish Empire in Europe for his pains.

As long as Russia is backed from the side by the Balkan states, there must be perpetual danger of war. There ought to be free navigation for all the world, and the only way to bring it about is to place Constantinople and the strait under a European position like Belgium and the Netherlands.

There is some apprehension here as to the possibility of a Russian attack on Austria and Italy. The Russian attitude is out of the conflicting ambitions of both countries in Europe.

Is it the sturdy Democracy which bore the heat and burden of the day, or is it the eleven-hour converts whose noses are not yet colored and who still wear colored shirts?

Will the Democracy stand this? Are we to sit in the cell in the promised land and then die in the third without employment? Is there no relief to come to us? Is it possible that I shud have to turn Republikan to get the place that belongs to me?

THE PARTY'S AGENT.

The President Must Carry Out His Party's Spoils Ideas—No Show for Republican Civil-Service Reform Principles.

The mutual-admiration correspondence between Dorman B. Eaton and President Cleveland upon the question of reforming the civil-service will deceive no one who understands the origin of that reform or who has intelligently watched its progress. Its appearance at this time upon the heels of the ringing resolutions in the New York Republican platform, and just prior to the meeting of the Democratic Convention on which was named the anti-Civil-Service-reform act machine-candidate Hill is intended to hold the niggumpump vote, otherwise the reply to Eaton's letter would have been made long ago.

The prospect of Civil-Service reform will show who have been its real friends. The first step towards that reform was taken in a resolution offered by Mr. Jencks (Republican) of Rhode Island in 1877. Its only encouragement in Congress was on the Republican side.

When Hayes' Administration came into power it made some vital recommendations for the increase of its efficiency, and the reform was re-nudged by the Republicans. During that Administration the idea became more strongly fixed than ever in the minds of Republicans, and when General Garfield was elected it gained new strength by his enthusiastic advocacy of the anti-spoils system.

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How has that expectation been met? Last fall a considerable number of distinguished Republicans in New York and New England bolted from the party, and bearing that in mind, Cleveland, in his campaign, made statements of reform, and was a sincere Civil-Service reformer who he had to do his job.
