CURRENT COMMENT.

W. C. N. CARE, United States Minister to Constantinople during the administrations of Presidents Polk and Tyler, died at Ashland, Va., recently of paralysis.

GIGANTIC forest fires were reported on the mountains in the vicinity of Tumpana, Pa., and the air was dense with smoke. The mountains for a distance of ten miles was one continuous sheet of flame. There was some fear that the fires would become as extensive as two years ago, when the entire population was compelled to turn out and fight the flames.

The total value of exports during the twelve months ended March 3, 1886, were \$605,656,920, and during the preceding twelve months \$743,791,634, a decrease of \$138,135,003. The values of the imports for the twelve months ended March 31, 1886, were \$614,758,654, and for the preceding twelve months \$696,262,754, an increase of \$81,506,601.

The Berlin *Fossische Zeitung*, in a special article treating of the German iron industry, asserts that the imposition of an additional duty of one mark per one hundred kilograms upon pig iron has resulted most unfavorably. It has prevented healthy competition and served to benefit a particular interest instead of the whole country. The paper presents an elaborate array of figures to prove its argument.

A dispute from Dublin, Ireland, says: "It has just become known that a missing chapter house, which was buried during the great fire here in the thirteenth century, has been discovered by some workmen who were excavating underneath Christ-Church Cathedral. In the chapter house were beautifully carved effigies, coins, tiles and various specimens of architecture. The discovery has created quite a sensation."

The French Chamber of Deputies, by a vote of 40 to 13, adopted the Exposition bill without the proposed amendment to require exhibitors to pay for their goods and reduce taxes on labor and material.

FRANCIS, President Arthur, at a budget press conference, declared that the report concerning the tax reductions might have been erroneous.
