Webster county W. C. T. U. held a convention in Red Cloud, April 9-10. Mrs. Brakefield, president, and Mrs. Hitchcock, state president, was present during the convention and spoke both evenings. Numerous towns and country places were represented and great unanimity prevailed. Reports show an increase in membership. Superintendents of the various branches of work, especially scientific, educational and Demorest medal contests made encouraging reports of work being done. Revs. Randall and Winters of Red Cloud and Sternberg of Kansas were present. Rev. Sternberg spoke from experience, strong words in favor of Kansas' successful prohibition, declaring reports of prohibition in Kansas a failure false. The convention passed resolutions strongly condemning the license system high or low and earnestly favoring the proposed constitutional amendment. The attendance and interest on the part of the citizens of Red Cloud was very good.
